

New-York Asylum for Lying-in Women. This charity, wholly supported by subscriptions and the donations of benevolent individuals, principally ladies, has existed 16 years. The statistics of the institution from the beginning, were not readily procurable. In the last annual report, 1838, it is stated that 149 patients had been admitted for the year ending March 10th. Since then, up to March 10th, 1839, 108 more—no deaths having occurred: 153 patients had been attended at their own dwellings. The board of managers consists of 33 females, who elect 6 directresses, a treasurer and secretary. The managers appoint 6 superintending and consulting physicians, who hold their offices till displaced by an unanimous vote. The physicians so elected appoint all the medical officers of the asylum. In connection, is an outdoor charity, and the city divided into 19 districts, with an attending physician. Expenses per annum, \$2118 66. *Attending Physicians*—J. A. Washington, M. D., J. H.
