Report of the Board of Managers



THE close of our second fiscal year finds us with an interesting retrospect and a hopeful outlook for the future. We are fortunate in retaining our efficient superintendent, Miss Abbie A. Pepper, whose administrative ability and careful management are much appreciated. Our internes, clinicians, druggists, and nurses have given faithful and intelligent service, as shown by the smooth running of the Hospital, as well as by the decided gain in attendance upon the daily clinics in the various departments of the Dispensary.

The report of the Committee of the Faculty (see page 21) shows marked progress both in amount and character of the medical work as compared with that of the previous year.

We also refer our friends to the interesting report of the Professor of Obstetrics (see page 54), giving an account of the work done by the College Maternity in one of the poorest sections of the City.

We record with regret two resignations from our Board, those of Dr. Gertrude A. Walker and Dr. Annina C. Rondinella. Dr. Walker was a charter member of the "Hospital and Dispensary of the Alumnae of the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania" (now the Amy S. Barton Dispensary); a merger between this institution and the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania was effected on March 14, 1904, giving to the Corporation thus formed hospital privileges. Dr. Walker has always been one of our most untiring and valued workers, and although absence from Philadelphia debars her from active service, we feel confident of her continued interest and sympathy. Dr. Rondinella, for several years, not only acted as our very efficient Treasurer, but served the Hospital in many ways, leaving a place that it will be very difficult to fill. We desire not only to record our distinct sense of loss, but also to extend our heartfelt good wishes to these two retiring Managers.

Since the publication of our last report, we have been fortunate in securing the co-operation of ten new members on our Board, whose names appear in the printed list of Managers.

Death has removed one of our honored Associate Members, Mr. Edward T. Dobbins, who for many years had been interested in the College, and in regard to whose unostentatious acts of kindness more than one student can give grateful testimony. Mr. Dobbins has still

further laid claim to our gratitude by the following generous bequests to the College and Hospital:—

Our appreciative thanks are due for the award of \$1,007.00 from the estate of the late Robert P. De Silver. This amount has been paid and appears in the Treasurer's report.

The enthusiastic interest and active co-operation of the students of the College was an important factor in the success of our first annual bazaar for the benefit of the building fund. This interest, however, has not been limited to this single occasion, and their appreciation of the clinical advantages afforded by the Hospital furnishes one of the strongest incentives to renewed effort on the part of the Managers.

The State Appropriation of \$12,500.00 annually for each of two years beginning June 1, 1905, has greatly lessened the anxiety of the Managers on the question of maintenance, but we are in need of contributions not only for maintenance but for a building fund.

The absence of a laundry adds a heavy item to the monthly bills. The entire lack of room for private patients not only deprives us of a source of income, but prevents the patients from availing themselves of the skill of our attending staff.

Last, but not least, the need of a clinical amphitheatre is most urgent. While all departments of the college are in need of financial aid, none appeals more to the public than the laboratory known technically as the hospital and in which students are prepared for what, after all, is the ultimate object of a medical education, the care of the sick and the wounded.

We take this opportunity to express our appreciation of the donation of money and of articles from our friends. The donations to the annual bazaar from students and other friends, including several prominent business firms, were so numerous that it has been found impossible to mention them or the names of the donors in detail. We therefore take this occasion to extend to all our warmest thanks.

Mr. Wm. J. Dornan has won our thanks for his very generous donations of printing.

While grateful to all whose gifts have helped us over the hard places, we appeal still further to the charitable, to those interested in the medical education of women, to help this, the hospital of the oldest and best known school in the world for the education of women in medicine;

a school which sends its graduates to all parts of the United States as well as to minister to suffering women in foreign lands.

Last June, the Managers began to raise money for a building fund, the aim being to secure contributions either in cash or in the form of subscriptions to a contingent fund. The account stands as follows:

Report of Main Hospital Department



URING the year ending April 30, 1906, the work of the Main Department of the College Hospital has progressed steadily. The total number of patients treated was three hundred and three (303); of this number, seventy (70) were males and two hundred and thirty-three (233) females. The capacity of the temporary pavilion has been taxed to the utmost and a number of patients were necessarily refused admission for lack of room. To have cared for all who applied, or who were referred to the institution, would have required twice the number of beds.

While the largest proportion of those treated belonged to the gynecological department, there were a number of important surgical cases, and the medical department presented an interesting and valuable service. The results obtained, notwithstanding lack of facilities and cramped quarters, have been very gratifying.

The growth in the Out-Patient Department during the year has been marked. At the Amy S. Barton Dispensary, a comparison of the statistics for last year with those herewith presented shows an increase of over one thousand patients. The demands of the Out-Practice of this department have become so heavy that it has been necessary to appoint a fourth interne, in order that one physician may be constantly free to attend patients at their homes. In the Dispensaries of the Main Department the greatest gains have been in the clinics for diseases of the eye and of the nose and throat. The evening dispensary service has developed and is destined to become a still more prominent and important feature of the work.

The thorough systematizing and management of the Clinical Laboratory, under the immediate charge of Dr. Charlotte B. Mitchell as director, has been of great assistance to all departments and of very practical benefit to the senior students, who have had the opportunity to make under supervision the various clinical investigations on cases to which they are assigned. The attention of physicians generally is especially called to the facilities which the laboratory affords for the careful and prompt examination of specimens of all kinds at moderate cost.

The rotation of resident physicians which came into operation July 1, 1905, has proved eminently satisfactory to all concerned. The plan

has secured to each appointee a three months' service in each of the following departments: Barton Dispensary, Maternity, and Junior and Senior Resident at the Main Hospital.

During the year three nurses completed the course of practical training offered by the institution, and their places have been filled by a corresponding number of probationers. The report of the Maternity refers to the special nursing arrangements of that department. In this connection the interest and devotion of the entire nursing and house staff are appreciatively acknowledged. Only those who have observed the work from day to day throughout the year can realize the value and character of the service rendered and the unselfish spirit shown.

From the point of view of affording clinical teaching, the Hospital has fully met the expectations of its founders. But, because of the very vitality of the enterprise, its growth imperatively calls for more space. The development which is possible is limited only by lack of funds for additional buildings and maintenance. The need of a clinical amphitheatre, and of accommodations for private patients, is immediately urgent, and in order that the work may not be seriously crippled these should be erected this year.

The retrospect of the year is encouraging, and the importance of the work in its relation to the equipment of medical women warrants that enlightened and sustained enthusiasm which bids us labor untiringly and which compels success.

Report of the Maternity Department



THE work of the Maternity Department during the past year has been continued along the lines already laid down, with few changes. One bed has been added to the front wards, giving place for one more bed-patient, but our space is far too limited to accommodate all those who apply, and turning away such prospective patients is one of our hardest tasks.

Dr. Mercedes Roberts' term of service as resident physician and superintendent ended July 1, 1905. Since that time the position of resident has been filled in rotation by the four internes of the College Hospital. Dr. Roberts kindly continued her work as superintendent during the summer months, and in September, Miss Sarah Short was appointed as head nurse to take charge of the housekeeping. The nursing staff, in addition to our nurses, includes pupil nurses from the Jewish Hospital as well as from St. Timothy's, and several graduate nurses have come to the Hospital for the experience which the out-practice affords.

The number of patients delivered in the Hospital has given to the third year students ample opportunity to observe the method of conducting a case before taking up their practical work in obstetrics. Some members of the class were present at as many as twelve deliveries. At the end of the year, when no students were on duty on account of the examinations, Dr. Ellen C. Potter and Dr. Rachel T. Moon gave valuable assistance in the out-practice.

Apart from the value of the Hospital as a teaching institution the importance of its charitable work should be emphasized. Although small amounts are collected from patients who are able to pay something, a large proportion of those who come to us are admitted absolutely free of charge. On leaving the Hospital many are referred to charitable organizations, the Woman's Directory in particular having given valued and constant aid in finding homes or work for such cases.

The hospital still has many needs. The quarters are cramped, and the equipment such that the work must often be done under unfavorable circumstances. That the faithful and conscientious work of the internes and nurses has been able successfully to overcome such obstacles is proved by the record which the Hospital has to show. The results in the out-practice are also thoroughly satisfactory. While we are proud to point to what can be done with our present small equipment, we look forward

to the time when with a larger building and increased facilities the service can be still further extended and improved.

The Hospital has many friends whose interest and kindness are remembered with grateful appreciation. While it is impossible to enumerate all, we offer our most hearty thanks to the Needlework Guild of America for its generous contributions, to the Board of Managers for its helpful co-operation, and to the students and hospital workers for their loyal and enthusiastic devotion at all times.
